Most of the castle rooms have diaphragm arches that were used to bear the wooden beams supporting the floors of the upper levels, although in some cases, such as in the prison, corbels were used.

The lower part of the outer wall of this room up to the height of the flared windows was part of the construction of the first half of the 14th century. To the right of the wall you can see the start of a primitive arch that had a more vertical outline. The beginnings of the other primitive arches in the room cannot be seen, because they were replaced by the arches from the extension begun at the end of the 14th century.

Now cross the chapter room and continue towards the hall of the castle.
