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The walls of Valderrobres consisted of six portals. Vergós, which began the road to Torre del Compte, and La Solana, which marked the path to La Fresneda, were on the west side. The one in San Roque, located to the south in front of the stone bridge, headed towards Ráfales and Fuentespalda. Cabo de Villa, from where the road to Beceite began, and that of Barrinol, which headed towards Arnes, were on the east side. And finally the portal of the church square was the natural exit to the north, where Cretas is located. Currently only the portal of San Roque and that of Vergós remain standing.

The wall made a turn after the portal of Vergós and went down directly to the old portal of the Solana. If you look down the alley on your right, you can see the remains of the wall, which was later cut down to build houses and streets. This alley and the garden area below it is called Barranquet, because like the calle Huesca formerly called de las Avenidas, they channelled much of the water from the mountains to the river.

All the portals were associated with some protector, usually a saint or an invocation of the Virgin. Vergós was protected by the Virgin of the Immaculate Conception; La Solana by the Virgin of the Portal; San Roque by the saint of the same name; Cabo de Villa by the the Virgin of the Snow; Barrinol by the Virgin of Mount Carmel; and the church square portal by Santa María la Mayor.
